



Internship Opportunity
Applications due May 9, 2025

The University of New Mexico's Center for Regional Studies (CRS) is pleased to announce a new initiative for UNM undergraduate and graduate students. CRS will award \$5,000 stipends to five UNM students for eight-week summer internships in New Mexico. The five awardees will have the opportunity to gain work experience with a State of New Mexico department or agency including state museums, historic sites, Office of Archaeological Studies, Historic Preservation Division, New Mexico Arts, New Mexico State Library, tribal governments or organizations, non-profit agencies or organizations, community-based organizations, or UNM-affiliated/based organizations.

CRS is a multidisciplinary outreach center designed to enhance the work of the University of New Mexico through student fellowships, research, program funding, visiting scholars, digital media and other projects with a particular emphasis on activities that increase our understanding of New Mexico, the U.S. Mexico Borderlands, Indigenous communities, and the Americas.

The employment timeframe for the summer internship needs to be between June 2, 2025, through July 31, 2025. This opportunity is open to any UNM undergraduate (junior or senior level) or graduate student. In addition to gaining work experience, the selected student will make a presentation to the UNM campus and broader community about their internship experience in the fall 2025 semester.

Stipend:

- \$5,000 (8-week appointment)

Qualifications:

- UNM undergraduate student (junior or senior level during the Fall 2025 semester)
- UNM graduate student (M.A., M.S., MFA, Ed.D., Ph.D., or J.D.)
- GPA 3.0 and above

Application Materials:

Completed applications must include the following:

- Current resume
- Current UNM transcript (Unofficial transcripts will be accepted.)
- Personal statement (3-5 pages) addressing educational goals, professional plans, and personal interest in the internship
- Letter of commitment from the state government, agency, tribal nation, non-profit, community-based organization, or UNM-affiliated or based organization
- Three recommendation letters (At least one letter must be from a UNM faculty member)

Assemble all materials and supporting documents into a single PDF file and submit to crsunm@unm.edu **no later than May 9, 2025.**
